Fast Facts

- The MRGCD was created by the legislature in 1925 and has now been promoting sustainable agriculture and responsible stewardship of the bosque for 85 years.
- The MRGCD delivers water to about 70,000 acres of cropland in the Middle Rio Grande Valley.
- This district stretches close to 150 river miles from Cochiti on the north to Bosque Del Apache Wildlife Refuge on the south, covering four counties: Bernalillo, Sandoval, Socorro and Valencia.
- The District owns and manages some 30,000 acres of bosque in the valley the largest continuous cottonwood forest in the world.
- The MRGCD operates and maintains some 1200 miles of laterals, ditches, canals and drains used to convey water to and from cropland.
- The district serves approximately 11,000 irrigators.
- MRGCD continues its support of efforts to sustain the habitats of the Rio Grande Silvery Minnow and the Willow Flycatcher.
